Absorbed Initial 'shocks' of reform

2012

- Assessed impact of ECR.
- Analysed rule changes.
- Check understanding.
- Prepare transition plan.

Faced reality of reforms & took action to prepare for transition

2013

- Determine whether ITAR or EAR applies to product portfolio.
- Major re-classification exercise.
- Specially Designed Test.
- Correlation of USML Categories to CCL ECCNs.

Established new licensing & compliance regime

2014

- · Product migration.
- Export Jurisdiction.
- · Classification & New licenses.
- License Exceptions.


Real challenges with US and UK suppliers

Communication and Training are essential





Conclusion

- Will take time to get used to the EAR.
- No early evidence that trade amongst NATO allies is more efficient.
- This will require single list, single agency & single IT system.
- Harmonisation of key ITAR & EAR terms.
- Harmonisation of licensing exceptions & structures.
- UK companies must think carefully about re-exports do I need a licence?
- Must be familiar with Commerce Country Charts.
- De-minimus concept & challenge of record-keeping.
- Challenge of International Import Certificates.
- Significant record-keeping requirements for re-exports & license exceptions.
